

First Aid Trainer

Within this role you will play an exciting part in supporting Leaders and centres within the Central England Region to deliver the DofE to more young people. You will be delivering high quality first aid training to Leaders, enabling them to validate their qualifications and experience, and to be able to take young people out into the outdoors.

The Central England Regional Training Team (CERTT) is a new team that is being established with keen enthusiastic trainers, who will pass on their love of the outdoors, first aid and the Expedition section to a new generation of Leaders. You will be passionate about training and supporting adults and will be a key part of the Regional Office Team. Your volunteering will directly support the Regional Office to engage more Leaders and therefore more young people in the DofE.

You will deliver a variety of first aid courses in a geographical area, which might include:

- Eight-hour Outdoor First Aid.
- 16-hours Outdoor First Aid.
- Teaching young people first aid.

You do not need any previous first aid training skills to undertake this role.

What we will offer you:

Full training to carry out this role will be offered – this will include:

- A nationally recognised teaching/training qualification if you don't already have one.
- A First Aid at Work (three day) certificate.
- A 16-hour Outdoor First Aid certificate.
- Training in delivering first aid training.



Also included is:

- Yearly Continuing Professional Development (CPD)
- Support from a first aid mentor.
- Internal quality assurance processes to support your course delivery.
- A full package of course resources and materials.
- Travel expenses (up to 200 miles per course).
- DofE polo shirt and hoody.
- Access to other Regional training courses where appropriate to the role.
- Free renewal of your first aid certificate when due.
- The opportunity to access additional outdoor qualifications where appropriate to the role.

What you need to be able to commit:

- To deliver sufficient courses per year to stay current (normally about six).
- To attend one CPD training day per year.
- To support us for a minimum period of three years.

You need to have access to:

- Your own vehicle.
- A laptop for delivering presentations on.
- Some storage space for the equipment, or able to travel to collect the equipment.

Essential:

- Ability to work well with adults and relate well to them.
- Able to work on own initiative and work alone.
- A passion for first aid.
- Good IT skills, able to use powerpoint and video resources.

Desirable:

- Experience in training adults.
- Ability to design and structure training courses.
- A teaching or training qualification.

Skills:

- Organised and efficient with course paperwork.
- Ability to think on your feet when faced with new situations.
