

Banks	These commercial organisations, found on the high street, often have funding available to support local communities.
Pupil Premium Funding	Additional funding for publicly funded schools in England. It's designed to help disadvantaged pupils of all abilities perform better and close the gap between them and their peers.
PTA (Parent and Teacher Association)	Fundraising activities are organised by parents and teachers. The money raised is donated to causes which help within the school.
Gift Your Gear	A nationwide initiative that provides outdoor clothing and equipment to those working with young people in the outdoors. People donate old kit and this is advertised to local community organisations, youth groups and charities to collect free of charge.
Diamond Funding	Funding available from the DofE to support the sustainable increase of disadvantaged young people participating in DofE. The funding can cover activities such as training, equipment for expeditions, participation places or could involve setting up a new project or club to help participants complete their Volunteering, Physical or Skills section (e.g. a school garden or environment club).
Supermarket token collection or votes	Shoppers are given a token at the checkout, which they place in the box of the good cause they would most like to support. The more tokens a cause gets, the bigger the donation they receive. Voting sometimes takes place online to choose the charity of the year.
Moor Boots	A scheme to assist young people from disadvantaged backgrounds to acquire personal expedition equipment, allowing them to participate in activities from which they wouldn't otherwise be able to. Small grants are made to selected individuals.
School Bursary Fund	A fund or bursary that is available within a particular school to support pupils. The criteria will vary within each fund, but often they will support pupils experiencing financial hardship.
Alpkit Foundation	A charity that enables people to 'Go Nice Places And Do Nice Things' by making small awards of funding to people, groups and schools that work to remove the barriers in getting outdoors and experiencing wild places.
NFP (Not for Profit Organisation)	Examples of these are Rotary Clubs, Women Institute and Lions Club. They meet regularly to complete charitable activities and then donate the money they raise each year to support activities in their local community.
Trust	A legal entity which can be set up by anyone who has decided that they want to set aside some of their assets or income for charitable causes. There are a number of these within the South West, each one has it's own eligibility criteria. See if you can find one in your local area!
Corporate fundraising	Income generated through a partnership or a relationship with a commercial organisation, which may provide money, skills or other resources to the community.
Community Foundations	They bring together the financial resources of individuals, families, and businesses to support non-profit organisations in their local geographic area.
Gift in kind	A kind of charitable giving in which, instead of giving money to buy needed goods or services, the goods or services themselves are given.
