


Route to accreditation

The following is the 'route to accreditation' for those wishing to do the Expedition Assessor Accreditation Scheme (EAAS) training and become an accredited Expedition Assessor:



Next steps

Reaccreditation

Accreditation normally lasts for five years. Assessors wishing to continue in the role will be notified by email six months before their accreditation is due to expire. Assessors must complete the Reaccreditation screen within eDofE in order to be reaccredited for a further five years and they need to be approved by the Licensed Organisation/Approved Activity Provider/Assessor Network they assess for.

New role

Assessors may decide to take on a new role (e.g. as Supervisor). LO/AN/AAPs should help them find a new challenge, and the LO/AN/AAPs DofE manager can end a registration with an Assessor via their LO eDofE account.

Retirement

Assessors may decide (in consultation with their LO/AN/AAP) to retire from their involvement with the DofE. LO/AN/AAPs should recognise their involvement and amend their relationship with the Assessor via their LO eDofE account.

Guidance on the accreditation of Expedition Assessors

An applicant must have completed the DofE's Assessor's training within the preceding 24-month period prior to the application being made.

Any applications made after 24 months from the date of their Assessor training will be rejected and the applicant asked to complete the training again.
