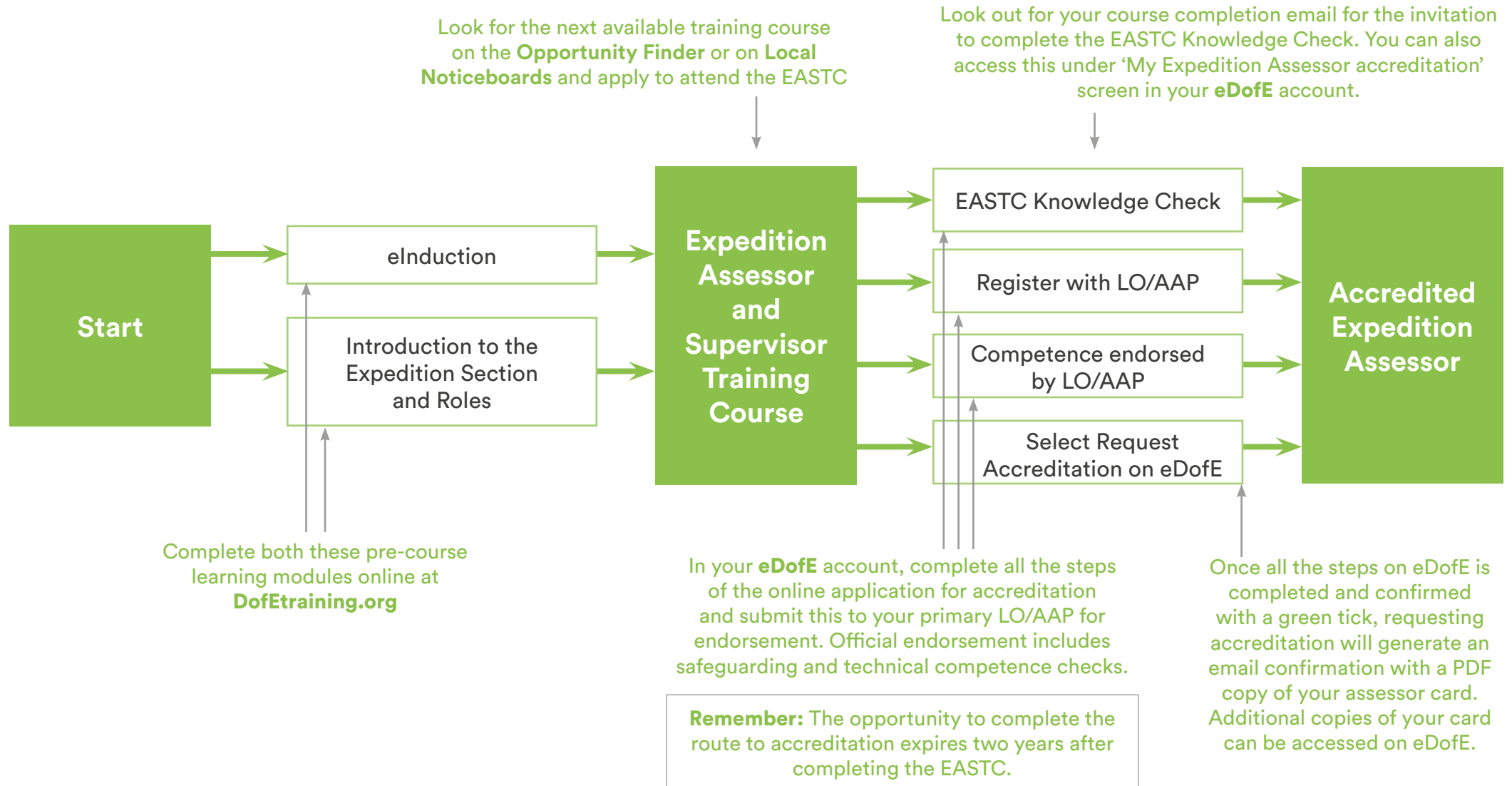


Route to accreditation

Next steps

Didn't complete the route to accreditation within two years of attending the EASTC?	Reaccreditation
<p>Book onto the next EASTC using the DofE opportunity finder and refresh your training to ensure you enter the role with the most up-to-date information. On this additional completion of the EASTC you will be given access to complete the steps for the route to accreditation for a further two years.</p>	<p>Accreditation normally lasts for five years. Assessors wishing to continue in the role will be notified by email six months before their accreditation is due to expire.</p> <p>Assessors must complete the Reaccreditation screen within eDofE in order to be reaccredited for a further five years. These steps include the successful completion of a Reaccreditation Knowledge Check.</p> <p>Once all the steps are completed you will be able to select Request Reaccreditation to receive email confirmation of your accreditation status with a PDF copy of your assessor card.</p>
New role	Retirement
<p>Assessors may decide to take on a new role (e.g. as Supervisor). LO/AAPs should help them find a new challenge and the LO/AAP's DofE Manager can end a registration with an Assessor via their LO eDofE account.</p>	<p>Assessors may decide (in consultation with their LO/AAP) to retire from their involvement with the DofE. LO/AAPs should recognise their involvement and amend their relationship with the Assessor via their LO eDofE account.</p>
